In not more than 5 pages, you should respond to each of the following items in your Fellowship proposals. Any additional supporting documentation may be provided as an appendix.

- 1) Please describe the interdisciplinary humanities research that you will conduct if you are granted a research faculty fellowship.
- 2) Describe how working collaboratively with one another and with the Center for Digital Research in the Humanities will enhance the goals of your research.
- 3) Suggest ways that your project might benefit the research or teaching of other scholars.
- 4) List any computer hardware, software, or other digital resources that you think will be necessary for the successful completion of your project, and estimate the cost for these items. Please note that most faculty and graduate students will be able to use equipment and software already available within the Center for Digital Research in the Humanities. If you think you have extraordinary equipment needs, please contact Walter or Ganim for advice before submitting your proposal.
- 5) What other support, in direct funding, release time, or other specific resources, have you already secured, or do you plan to seek, for this project?

6) What other online research are you aware of that is relevant to your own project, either in content or in method?

Include the following with your application:

A current curriculum vitae.

A 1-page budget describing how you would use the \$20,000 award.

A statement of demonstrated support signed by your department's Chair. Demonstrated support might be providing a course release, a graduate research assistant, equipment or other tangible support.
